CABRA AGAINST RACISM

In recent months, racists have been knocking on doors in Cabra. These people are not community activists, they are organised fascists. They want to incite hate towards our non-white and non-Irish neighbours.

These racists also have openly displayed their hatred towards women and the LGBTQ+ community. Cabra is a community for everyone and these attempts to divide us will not be tolerated.

Say no to racism, and yes to community!

It's time they were stopped. People are struggling to heat their homes, to pay rent and put food on the table. This new 'party' places the blame for the housing crisis on immigrants, when responsibility for our housing and homelessness crisis lies 100% with the political leaders who have shaped Government policy in recent decades, abandoning the building of public housing and allowing property speculators and financial interests to dominate, putting profits for a few before the best interest of the population.

Ireland relies on its migrant workers in all areas of society and our communities. For example, in Irish hospitals and care facilities - doctors, nurses, care assistants and cleaners are largely migrant workers. At the beginning of the pandemic we were applauding them and their Irish colleagues. They are not to blame for the cost of living crisis and the ever rising prices.

To demand an end to the spiraling cost of living we need to stand together, not divided. We cannot let this hate group benefit from our real concerns and fears. The most concerning thing about this group of racists now putting leaflets through doors in Cabra, are their toxic, hate-filled ideas. Their 'party' leader, who recently sought election to the Dáil, has spoken at Neo-Nazi rallies in Europe and has connections to fascists in the UK and US.

On social media they engage in racist, sexist, anti-Semitic, Islamophobic and homophobic commentary. They want to change the law to remove citizenship from hundreds of thousands of Irish nationals and to deport thousands of people who have made Ireland their home. They want to ban same sex marriage, they want the death penalty for Doctors who perform abortions and they want to close places of worship. They may be small and have little support, but we can't allow their hate to grow. It's time we kicked them out of Cabra.
